How environmental law contributes to the One Health approach in practice?

Context


The Chief Justices from ASEAN have agreed to take measures to strengthen environmental law adjudication and enforcement in the region. They are thus aiming at developing the training of law practionners (judges, lawyers, civil servants) in environmental law but the health implication of environmental law is not integrated into the curricula.

A 2022 UNGA resolution acknowledges the right to a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment and affirms that its promotion "requires the full implementation" of the multilateral environmental agreements.

This right is already acknowledged in various constitutions of ASEAN countries but what does it mean in practice?

Environmental law and policies implementation





Design of a high-level training

Audience targeted

- Lecturers, prof. in Environmental Law willing to expand their knowledge on the One Health approach and integrate it in their teaching materials.
- Policy-makers involved into Environmental Law/policy decisions at the regional, national or local level
- Professionals of justice: Judges (Green benches in country), association of lawyers working in Environmental Law, Environmental NGOs.

Purpose

- advocate for the environmental and ecological dimension of the One Health.
- Raise awareness of the audience regarding the One Health approach and the role it may/should have in environmental law and in policies linked to the environment



Facilitates cooperation and coordination among the ten ASEAN Member States (AMS) and with regional and international organizations on the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity.

- engage representatives from the legal and policy offices of concerned agencies in order to sensitize them to the multi-faceted aspects of the One Health approach and the role it may have in environmental law and in policies linked to the environment
- foster its integration into their practices to advocate for the environmental and ecological dimension of the One Health
- provide a platform to impart knowledge on the environmental dimension of One Health, and its implementation and practices in the region.
- This training will serve as a preparatory meeting for the high level ASEAN cross-pillar meeting for One Health, which ACB could propose to the ASEAN.

Participants

Representatives from the Legal and Policy Divisions of respective Ministries (Human Health, Agriculture, and Environment) of the ASEAN Member States, and selected ACB Technical Staff.

Expected outputs

- Participants are aware on the One Health approach and its role in laws and policies that are linked to the environment; and
- Participants advocate for specific institutional and policy reform that takes into consideration the environmental and ecological dimension of the One Health approach.
